I means the Unit Standard is assessed internally.

These Unit Standards are taken from the BCITO (Building Construction Industry Training Organisation) apprenticeship programme. Other BCITO Unit Standards will be added throughout the year as necessary.

What will I learn?

Students will learn about safety issues in the workplace, further develop their practical skills, and develop an understanding of woodworking skills and processes used in the building and construction industry.

How will I learn?

Standards are arranged to be part of the major project that students will work on. Units are used at specific points in the development of the project to clarify necessary skills and knowledge. It may be possible to complete up to four projects over a two year period.

What should I have already done?

Developed an interest in woodworking.

Where does the subject lead?

These are all pre-apprenticeship units developed for the specific needs of general building and joinery trades.

How is the course assessed?

All units are internally assessed, comprising a short theory test and a practical aspect based on observations as to how students use knowledge and understanding gained from the theory hand books, and completion of specific projects.
