What will I learn?

By the end of the year you will have:

- Developed further listening, speaking, reading and writing competence in Te Reo.
- Extended your vocabulary in ter reo maori.
- Have a knowledge of all types of waiata.
- Organised a kapa haka wananga or hui at the marae.
- Demonstrated knowledge and understandings of the workins of ahui.
- Develop research skills (waiata).
- Presented material about waiata-a-ringa / haka / poi / waiata (kapa haka leaders).

How will I learn?

Through participation in kapa haka (waiata), marae visits, learning with other tutors, on-going lessons, watching kapa haka national groups on video / DVD.

What should I have already done?

NCEA Level 1 Te Reo Maori, and been a member of our kapa haka roopu.

Where does the subject lead?

This leads to NCEA Level 3 Performing Arts, the entertainment industry, kapa haka tutoring.

How is the course assessed?

Through competing at Kapa Haka competitions. Research projects and awarding of credit are internally assessed. Kapa haka roopu participation is encouraged.

Other details: (costs, field trips etc)

Both the regional and national kapa haka competitions require commitment to culture group and students need to have high expectations of themselves as learners, speakers, listeners and writers of Maori.
